**Finance Committee.** Val reported that Will Ksander is willing to do the audit for 2011/12 and for 2012/13. Work on the budget will happen after the new committee clerks create their budgets.

Year-to-date income is \$10,430 and expenses are \$9771. If we give all the donations recommended by the Peace & Justice Committee last fall, expenses will be \$10,371, still below our income. We approved making all the recommended donations.

Ministry & Care Committee. The Arrangements Committee for Kelly & Rick's wedding plan to meet at the Morton Arboretum on June 6. A gift card was purchased for an expectant mother who grew up in our Meeting.

**Old Business.** The State of Society Report was reviewed and changes were made.

New Business. We decided to not participate in A Day in Our Village this year.

### **QUERY QUOTATIONS**

Rooted in the history of Friends, queries reflect the Quaker way of life, reminding Friends of the ideals we seek to attain. We approach queries as a guide, using them not as an outward set of rules, but as a framework within which we assess our convictions and examine prayerfully the direction of our lives and the life of the community. Here are a few selections from Faith and Practice, published in 1997 by Philadelphia Yearly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends:

### **Equality**

How does our Meeting help to create and maintain a society whose institutions recognize and do away with the inequities rooted in patterns of prejudice and economic convenience?

Is our Meeting open to all regardless of race, ability, sexual orientation, or class?

What steps are we taking as a Meeting to assure that our Meeting and the committees and institutions under our care reflect our respect for all and are free from practices rooted in prejudice?

Do I examine myself for aspects of prejudice that may be buried, including beliefs that seem to justify biases based on race, gender, sexual orientation, disability, class, and feelings of inferiority or superiority?

What am I doing to help overcome the contemporary effects of past and present oppression?

Am I teaching my children, and do I show through my way of living, that love of God includes affirming the equality of people, treating others with dignity and respect, and seeking to recognize and address that of God within every person?
